

Colourful street murals in Hanoi

The murals painted on the sealed archways of the railway viaduct on Phung Hung Street, Hanoi have been completely finished, bringing a new, lively look to the area.



19 paintings by artists from Vietnam and the Republic of Korea (RoK)'s from November, 2017.



The contemporary style paintings create a space that connects the city's heritage with its artistic and community values.



Upon completion, the area will become a pedestrianised street linking to the space of Dong Xuan market, to create a new highlight among the tourist spaces in Hanoi's Old Quarter.



The paintings evoke Hanoi's thousand years of culture, showing a city which while facing great changes, always preserves its cultural and traditional quintessence.
